Local student posts online thank you for World Teachers' Day

A Carine Senior High School student was one of the first in WA to post an online 'thank you' message to his maths teacher as part of World Teachers' Day celebrations on 30 October 2009.

"Mr Hackett, your unique teaching style and inclusion of interesting facts into a lesson made for a really enjoyable year," Year 11 student Tom wrote.

"It's thanks to you that my maths ability has picked up so much and that I am now doing (and passing) a higher maths course than previously planned."

This is one of many messages being left by students, parents and community members who want to celebrate the work of teachers who have made a difference to their lives.

The Department of Education has set up an online blog so people can post messages for public school teachers.

Deputy Director General Schools, Margery Evans, said World Teachers' Day was the perfect occasion to say thank you to an outstanding teacher.

"Many students and parents want to show their appreciation to teachers, and the blog is a convenient, simple way to do this," Ms Evans said.

"Teachers play a central role in nurturing and guiding children and young people through the lifelong learning process. Not only do they educate our children, they support them in their everyday lives."

Tom's mother Helen said it was great students and parents could post messages for teachers like John Hackett.

"Tom is reaching a crucial part of his school career, so it is fantastic he has found a teacher who has inspired him in this subject," Helen said.

Ms Evans said former students and members of the community could also post messages to their teachers.

"Many of us can look back and recognise how a favourite teacher helped shape who we are today," she said.

"Some people do not realise until several years later how much support they received from their teachers and how they made a positive contribution in their lives. I would also encourage those people to post an online message."
