2009 School Highlights

- Our year 12 students had a very successful year achieving 100% graduation. All year 12 completed their *Community Service* hours.
- Science HOLA, Lorraine Ellis, won the *2009 Eureka Australian Science Teacher of the Year*.
- Our school won a \$50,000.00 *Impact Award* from our partnership with the City of Bunbury. Funds will be used to enhance Science programs at Newton Moore SHS.
- We were ranked as one of the top 50 public schools for the fourth year in a row.
- Our year 12 students achieved four Curriculum Council awards: Two *Certificates of Excellence* and two *Certificates of Distinction*.
- In 2009 Newton Moore SHS was selected as a *Microsoft Innovative School*.
- The *Australian Environment Art* display was highly successful with a wide variety of Year 11 & 12 student Art work being displayed.
- Newton Moore SHS hosted the *2009 Queens Cup*, an extremely successful South West event.
- The school concert band went on an International tour for ten days to Singapore.
- Clontarf Football Academy boys went to Alice Springs and played in various local carnivals.
- Two Clontarf students, Lewis Jetta and Neville Jetta, were selected to play in AFL football teams.
- *Leadership in Physical Education (LIPEP)* started in 2009. The focus has been on promoting excellence in sports and leadership.
- We won the 2009 district *Winter Carnival* and we had a total of nine teams compete in a variety of different sports.
- In 2009 the school had 18 representatives in state and national sports and events ranging from inline skating, taekwondo to soccer.
- Literacy events in 2009 included the *Great Book Swap*, *Book Week* celebrations, the *MS Readathon*, continued use of the *Writers Guide* and the development of a whole school literacy plan.
- *Community Services* projects continued to be highly successful including the Kemerton tree planting, cooking for the *In Town Lunch Centre*, assisting at the *Wildlife Bird Park*, helping out at the *Aged Care Games*, *Clean Up Australia* and many more fun but community minded projects.
- Three students from Year 12 gained a pre TEE placement into Murdoch University engineering courses.
- Newton Moore SHS began hosting the district PEAC program for Year 4 - 7 and delivered a specialist Science program to year 7 PEAC students from across the district.
- Students from the *Science Horizons Specialist Program* participated in a number of special project including Marine Studies, data logging and fish breeding.
- The school has continued to develop strong community partnerships with universities and community groups.
- *Science Horizon* students presented a paper at the international *Firestarter Conference* in Canberra.
- Newton Moore SHS came second in the annual *Country Week* competition.
- Our girl's soccer team were semi finalists in the state wide *Champion Teams* competition.
- Students and staff toured Italy as part of a cultural exchange with our Italian sister school.
